General

Data protection is a question of trust, and your trust is important to us. We respect your private life and privacy. It is a major concern for Lunchgate that your personal data is treated in a responsible manner and in compliance with the legal requirements.

Under the Ordinance 2 on measures to combat coronavirus (COVID-19) of the Federal Council, restaurants are permitted to resume operations as of 11 May 2020 under the condition that they have an appropriate health protection concept in place. According to the sectoral health protection concept drawn up by GastroSuisse ("Protection Concept"), restaurants are to collect and temporarily store certain personal data of their guests. The personal data of one person per table shall be stored. The disclosure of personal data is voluntary for the guests.

This privacy policy describes how Lunchgate processes personal data that it collects from users of Lunchgate applications ("Users") for the restaurants specifically based on the current Protection Concept to combat COVID-19.

Lunchgate also collects personal data from Users in the ordinary course of business (such as in connection with the normal operation of the reservation platform). The processing of such personal data is subject to the data protection provisions set out in the terms and conditions of use of the reservation system, which are hereby expressly reserved.

With your declaration of acceptance of the terms set out herein on foratable.com, you agree to this data privacy policy.

Personal Data Collected

Based on GastroSuisse's current Protection Concept in connection with COVID-19, the User shall be given the option to register the following personal data ("Personal Data") at the beginning of his or her visit to the restaurant, unless the User has already provided his or her Personal Data as part of a relevant reservation: First name, surname, telephone number, date and time of the restaurant visit, and the table number.

The provision of personal data by the User at the beginning of his or her visit to the restaurant is mandatory.

The User transmits the personal data during his or her visit to the restaurant by scanning a QR code on site and filling in the corresponding online form.

Purpose, Storage and Transfer of Personal Data

Personal Data is collected, stored and passed on solely for the purpose of tracing COVID-19 infection chains in accordance with current legislation and the recommendations by the federal and cantonal authorities and the GastroSuisse trade association.

The Personal Data is stored at Lunchgate. It is made available exclusively to the restaurant and, where required by applicable legislation or recommendations, to the competent federal and cantonal authorities for further processing.

Restaurants cannot access Personal Data of guests or statistics of other restaurants. The only exception is that restaurants that are operated by one or more affiliated companies (gastronomy groups companies) may pass on information on restaurant guests between the individual restaurants.

Unless otherwise ordered or requested by the competent federal or cantonal authorities, the personal data will be destroyed completely 14 days after the restaurant visit.

Protection of Personal Data

Lunchgate uses technical and organizational measures to protect Personal Data against loss, misuse, unauthorized access, disclosure, alteration or destruction. Our security measures are continuously improved in line with technological developments.

Languages

This data privacy policy is available in a German, an English, a French and an Italian version. In the event of any ambiguities or discrepancies, the German version shall prevail.

In addition, we refer to the terms and conditions of use of our reservation system.
